








Traffic deaths are up since 2020

MINNEAPOLIS FATAL CRASHES

45 lives lost to speeding/red light running in Minneapolis in the last 3 years


In 2022 - 2024:

- 43 people were killed in crashes involving clear speeding
- 19 people were killed in crashes involving red light running
- 17 killed in crashes that involved both speeding and red light running

Disproportionate impacts

In Transportation Equity Priority Areas 1 and 2:





2023-2025 Vision Zero Action Plan

- Traffic safety cameras are just one of many traffic safety priorities
- Other notable strategies include:
 - Proactive safety treatments on High Injury Streets
 - Installing safety treatments in all new street projects
 - Using street designs to address dangerous speeding







Traffic safety camera intro

- Provide automated enforcement of traffic laws
 - State law allows pilot for speeding and red light running



States with traffic safety camera programs



Previous engagement

- Have heard more support than opposition in all recent engagement
- Feedback to date helped shape approach for the State law – worked to address concerns

Combined results from 3,500+ responses



Traffic safety camera pilot law adopted in 2024

- Authorizes a 4-year pilot for Minneapolis and Mendota
 Heights for speeding and red light running
- Requires independent evaluation
- Regulates traffic safety cameras to protect for fairness, equity, privacy, including:
 - Limiting fines/fees/penalties
 - Can contest citations & owner not liable if not driving
 - Restricting use of cameras to only enforcing speeding and red light running


Other State law details for Minneapolis pilot

- MPD is not allowed to implement or substantively coordinate on the pilot
- Any revenue generated must go to implementation costs or traffic safety / traffic calming measures

Minneapolis traffic safety camera pilot goals

- Safety
 - Improve safety by reducing traffic crashes and supporting safe driving.
- Trust
 - Be transparent and honest in decision making and evaluation.
- Fairness
 - Enforce traffic rules in an equal and unbiased way.
- Equity
 - Plan and implement a system that is fair and just for all communities.
- Efficiency
 - Deliver a cost-efficient system that is well managed.

Timeline for Minneapolis traffic safety camera pilot




Potential camera locations

- State law max of 42 locations during pilot
- Anticipate:
 - Launching with ~5 speed safety camera locations
 - Expanding to 10+ locations in 2026 & adding red light cameras
- Public Works will complete camera location study in summer 2025
 - Informed by community engagement, crash analysis, speed/red light running data, and equity


Initial potential camera locations

- Meet State requirements
- Only City street locations
- Locations prioritized based on recent injury crash history
- Ensured there are 2+ candidates in each Ward
- Final selected locations will be distributed fairly throughout the city

Key upcoming steps for Minneapolis traffic safety camera pilot

- Engagement continuing through mid-May
- Finalize camera location analysis: summer 2025
- Public information campaign: summer/fall 2025
- Earliest potential launch: August 1, 2025
- Pilot authorized to continue through July 31, 2029

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State law regulations protect fairness while addressing unsafe behavior


- All locations must have advance warning signage and be listed on City's and MnDOT's website
- Speed camera violations at 10+ mph over speed limit
- 1 month warning period at start. 1st violation for each person is a warning
- \$40 citations
 - Can take a free traffic safety class in lieu of first citation
 - \$84 max charge in collections if someone never pays
 - \$80 if 20+ mph over limit (doubles like other speeding tickets)
- Owners can contest citations
 - Owners aren't liable if they provide sworn statement they were not driving vehicle at the time or vehicle was stolen or transferred before the violation
- Violations do not go on driving records
- Cannot be grounds for revoking or suspending a driver's license or for arrest or for towing a vehicle
- All violations must be confirmed by a trained enforcement agent
 - O 3rd party vendors are prohibited from sending citations

State law regulations protect privacy

- Traffic safety cameras can only be used for traffic safety enforcement and can't capture pictures that can identify people
 - Cameras can only take picture of back license plate
 - Can't be used as license plate readers
- Warnings and citations go to owner of the vehicle
 - Like parking tickets or school bus arm camera violations
- Cameras can only record data if detect a violation
- Data practice protections, including requirements for data destruction


Dangerous speeding is a significant challenge that has grown since 2020

Speed safety cameras

- In 23 states & D.C. & ~305 communities
- MnDOT 2023 study:
 - Every methodologically sound study of US speed camera systems has found reductions in deaths, injuries, crashes, and speeds
 - Studies have found 19-56%
 reduction in severe/fatal crashes
- FHWA: can reduce injury crashes up to 47%
 - "Proven safety countermeasure"

Red light cameras

- In 23 states & D.C. & ~342 cities
- 2020 study that reviewed 41 analyses of red light cameras:
 - "Associated with 20% decrease in total injury crashes"




Traffic safety camera legal note

- Traffic safety cameras have not been found unconstitutional in any state (as long as the program is well designed)
- MN Supreme Court did not consider the constitutionality of brief previous
 Minneapolis red light camera project;
 - Court determined that Minneapolis did not have the statutory authority to implement the system as it was structured
- A legislative change was necessary to fully support an effective and legal traffic safety camera program

Camera locations

State requirements:

- Must identify locations based on a local study
- Must be within 2,000' of a school
- Must be at locations with a traffic safety concern
- Cameras must be distributed fairly throughout the city
